Being a Member Pays! NCC to disburse \$1.5 million in capital credit dividends this summer.

We are excited to announce that as a cooperative member-owner, you could be receiving a dividend check as a part of our capital credits program!

THE COOPERATIVE BENEFIT As a member-owned cooperative, the credits represent each member's ownership of NCC. Capital credits are the margins credited or allocated annually by the NCC Board of Directors to the members of the cooperative based on their purchases from the cooperative the previous year. These margins are used by the cooperative as capital to operate the business for a period of time. Based on the financial condition of the cooperative, any excess is returned to the members in the form of capital credit dividends.

MEMBER ELIGIBILITY OF DIVIDENDS The \$1.5 million retirement will be distributed to members doing business with the cooperative in the years of 1994, 1995, 1996 and/or 2021. Both longstanding and new members will receive a check to be sent out in the July/August timeframe. Please make sure the address on file with us is current and report any changes to NCC at (701) 568-3331.

We wish them both the best in the future, and have enjoyed the time they have spent with us at NCC. Please congratulate Linda and Glen if you see them around!




Tech Tip! Internet Security FAQs

Every person who uses the Internet must take steps to ensure that their device and their data are safe. But with all of the products and programs out there today, it can be hard to know where to start. Here is a short answer to some of the most commonly asked questions about Internet security. - **1. What is malware?** Malware, short for malicious software, is designed to infiltrate or damage a computer system without the owner's consent. Malware is often distributed through email attachments, fake advertisements, and infected applications or websites. Once it finds a way in, it can be used to steal information, monitor user activity, and even extort money.
- **2. How can I prevent malware?** The most obvious way to prevent malware from destroying your device is to install antivirus and anti-spyware software. But you can't stop there; update your security tools regularly to make sure they are running properly. Other ways to prevent malware include using distinct, strong passwords for all accounts and setting spam filters to reduce unwanted emails.
- **3.** How can I safely browse the Internet? The most effective ways to stay safe on the Internet are often the simplest: Avoid questionable websites. Update your operating system regularly. Annual Meeting Highlights

The 2022 NCC Annual Meeting of members was held at NCC in Ray on Tuesday, June 21st, 2022. A delicious picnic style meal was served by the NCC employees to over 260 people at the NCC warehouse. Prior to the business meeting, DMJ, a mother-daughter duo from Williston entertained the crowd. About 24 children enjoyed the kids' activities, including inflatables and the Kidz Korner where kids were able to try out some Virtual Reality Goggles. Members were encouraged to visit the demonstration booths including a

Virtual Reality Experience, NCC Video, myNCC Connect App, and to sign up for SmartHub.

The business meeting was called to order by President, AJ Cvancara at 6:00PM. Jennifer Gjovig, Legal Counsel reported on By-laws changes. Jen Bingeman reported on the co-op's audited financial state at the end of 2021. NCC had a strong year financially generating a net margin of nearly \$6 million, which allowed NCC to allocate the largest

distribution of members' equity. We continue to invest in the network, in addition to paying off the \$30 million accumulated due to the fiber build out. Electronics, redundant routes and increased capacity of broadband will be the co-ops largest expenses in the future.

Two directors, Lorena Lambrecht, District #6 representing Tioga and Leslie Grubb, District #5 for Powers Lake and Columbus were re-elected to a three year term to the Board of Directors. General Manager/CEO, Jeremy Becker stated that 'NCC is on the leading edge of serving members with high speed broadband internet service.' The demand for Internet climbs as the applications and uses for it continue to multiply. He was happy to announce that the NCC Board of Directors approved a \$1.5 million general retirement for 2022 (see page 1 for more information on this). Members having done business with NCC in 1994, 1995, 1996 and/or 2021 will see a check in the mail sometime in July/August timeframe.

Many prizes were given away throughout the meeting. The \$500 Grand Prize was awarded to Michael & Ronica Pederson (Tioga). Members who visited at least one of the booths were entered to win a 42" SmartTV, which went to Vincent Grant (Powers Lake). 2022 Grant Deadlines

As a cooperative, we have a concern for community. In 2021, NCC donated nearly \$60,000 back to the communities we serve, in the form of donations, sponsorships, and scholarships. And as a cooperative, we share our financial success with our members. We are excited to again offer the following grant opportunities:

✓ Rural Development Finance Corporation (RDFC) Grant:

NCC and the other Rural ILECs in ND are given \$2,000 to distribute to community owned entities, non-profits and other community-based projects. The minimum grant amount is \$500; the maximum is \$2,000. *Applications due October 10, 2022.*

About RDFC: RDFC is a non-profit corporation owned by North Dakota's electric and telecommunications cooperatives. NCC is a member of RDFC. RDFC's mission is to promote rural economic development, primarily focusing on creating new jobs and enhancing essential community services and facilities by providing affordable financing. They have larger loan programs that fund community-based projects and non-profit entities with low interest loans. ✓ Foundation for Rural Service (FRS) Grant:
